



# Second quarter of 2022

# Annual increase in labour costs at 4.0% in euro area Increase at 4.4% in EU

In the second quarter of 2022, the hourly labour costs rose by 4.0% in the **euro area** and by 4.4 % in the **EU**, compared with the same quarter of the previous year. These figures are published by **Eurostat**, **the statistical office of the European Union**.

The two main components of labour costs are wages & salaries and non-wage costs. In the **euro area**, wages & salaries per hour worked increased by 4.1%, while the non-wage component rose by 3.8% in the second quarter of 2022, compared with the same quarter of the previous year. In the **EU**, hourly wages & salaries increased by 4.5% and the non-wage component by 4.1% in the second quarter of 2022.



#### Breakdown by economic activity


In the second quarter of 2022 compared with the same quarter of the previous year, hourly labour costs in the **euro area** rose by 4.3% in the (mainly) non-business economy and by 3.9% in the business economy: +2.2% in industry, +2.8% in construction and +4.9% in services. In the **EU**, hourly labour cost grew by 4.2% in the (mainly) non-business economy and by 4.4% in the business economy: +2.9% in industry, +3.3% in construction and +5.3% in services.

#### Wage costs

In the **EU**, the economic activities that recorded the highest annual increases in hourly wage costs were: NACE Rev. 2 section B – 'Mining and quarrying' (+6.9%), N – 'Administrative and support service activities' (+6.6%), M – 'Professional, scientific and technical activities' (+6.3%) and I – 'Accommodation and food service activities' (+6.0%).

#### Non-wage costs


The two economic activities with the biggest annual increases in the non-wage component were NACE Rev. 2 section I – 'Accommodation and food service activities' (+41.0%) and R – 'Arts, entertainment and recreation' (+14.1%), while NACE Rev. 2 section F – 'Construction' recorded a decrease of 0.4%.

#### Hourly wage costs across countries

In the second quarter of 2022 compared with the same quarter of the previous year, the highest increases in hourly wage costs for the whole economy were recorded in **Hungary** (+14.9%) and **Bulgaria** (+14.6%). Four more EU Member States recorded an increase above 10% namely: **Lithuania** (+12.4%), **Romania** (+11.7%), **Poland** (+11.1%) and **Estonia** (+10.1%). By contrast, the lowest increase in hourly wage costs for the whole economy was recorded in **Greece** (+0.8%).



#### **Geographical information**

The euro area (EA19) includes Belgium, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Portugal, Slovenia, Slovakia and Finland.

The European Union (EU27) includes Belgium, Bulgaria, Czechia, Denmark, Germany, Estonia, Ireland, Greece, Spain, France, Croatia, Italy, Cyprus, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Hungary, Malta, the Netherlands, Austria, Poland, Portugal, Romania, Slovenia, Slovakia, Finland and Sweden.

#### Methods and definitions

The Labour Cost Index is a short-term indicator showing the development of hourly labour costs incurred by employers, in nominal terms, that is without adjusting for price developments. It is calculated dividing the labour cost in national currency by the number of hours worked. Therefore, the development of variables, labour costs and hours worked, affect the evolution of the index (base year = 2016).

The quarterly changes in hourly employers' costs are measured for total labour costs and its main components: wages and salaries; and non-wage costs (labour costs other than wages and salaries). Total labour costs (TOT) cover wage and non-wage costs less subsidies. They do not include vocational training costs or other expenditures such as recruitment costs, spending on working clothes, etc.

Wage and salary costs (WAG) include direct remuneration, bonuses, and allowances paid by an employer in cash or in kind to an employee in return for work done, payments to employees saving schemes, payments for days not worked and remuneration in kind such as food, drink, fuel, company cars, etc.

Labour costs other than wages and salaries (OTH - non-wage costs) include the employers' social contributions plus employment taxes regarded as labour costs less subsidies intended to refund part or the entire employer's cost of direct remuneration.

Eurostat publishes Labour Cost Index data for NACE Rev. 2 sections B to S. The aggregate is referred to as "Whole economy" for the sake of simplification, although NACE Rev. 2 sections A: 'Agriculture, forestry and fishing'; T: 'Activities of households as employers; undifferentiated goods and services producing activities of households for own use' and U: 'Activities of extraterritorial organisations and bodies' are excluded.

Recording of COVID-19 support schemes: the main schemes introduced by EU governments to alleviate the impact of the COVID-19 pandemic on enterprises and employees consisted in short-term work arrangements and temporary lay-offs. In most cases, schemes were recorded as subsidies (or tax allowances) with a negative sign in the non-wage component of the labour cost index. However, when government directly compensated the employees without channelling the support through the employer, the corresponding amounts were not recorded in labour cost statistics. Detailed guidance on the recording of government schemes related to the COVID-19 crisis in labour cost statistics can be found here.

#### **Revisions and timetable**

The Labour Cost Index data are subject to revision, in particular for the latest quarters, when new source data become available. The original data, before any subsequent revision, are also available here.

For some Member States, COVID19-related support schemes may not yet been recorded in full in the non-wage component of the labour cost. Please note in particular that the data for the second quarter of 2022 are provisional for most of the countries.

Compared with the News Release 68/2022 of 16 June 2022, the annual growth rate for the total economy for the first quarter of 2022 for both euro area was revised from +3.8% to +4.2% for the euro area and from +4.2% to +4.5% for the EU.
